

Jesus left the desert and set about the Great Rescue. He was going to get all God's people back.


This is a picture of the desert, it's a bit different to last week's and this is to remind us that the desert changes at different times of the day, night and year.

- If you think Jesus did the right thing or not?

When Jesus was tempted, he said no

'man does not live on bread alone' This was the last time Jesus was tempted and he was offered the world, if he stopped worshipping God and worshiped someone else. Jesus said NO

Prayers

Praying for our Family

Jesus went into the desert to do what God asked and to be tested. We pray for our family at this time because we are all being tested in many ways

- *You will need*

White paper or card, Some help from an adult
Something to make a hole in the top, Coloured Pencils, Scissors

- **What to do**

Take the white paper or card and draw a Gingerbread man or woman shape & cut it out.

Make a hole in the top of the head

Then decorate the front of the Gingerbread person, and write the name of a member of your family on the front.

Then on the back write or draw a prayer for that person.

You can make one for each member of the family

Then use some ribbon or wool, and thread it through the hole and hang them up somewhere in your home, to remind you of those people.

- **Hand prayer**

We have our hands with us all the time, and we can pray at any time

- **You will need**

Some paper or card

A pencil

Coloured pencils

Something to make a hole

- **What to do**

Take the paper or card and draw round one of your hands.

Then draw or write on each finger and your thumb what you are going to pray for. You may want to follow the picture to decide which finger you are praying for your family.

From your Lent bag

• *The Stone*



In your lent bag you will find a stone.

This stone is to represent the part in the story where the devil said to Jesus "To turn the stones into bread if you are hungry, and Jesus said there is more important things than bread.

If you can find a special space in your home, where you like to be, hold the stone in your hand sit quietly and think about what it feels like when you are very hungry. When you are hungry you probably go to the cupboard for a snack. There are lots of people in this world who are not able to do that. Maybe you can give something to the food bank when you go shopping with your Mum or Dad or carer.

• **Activities**

Pretzel (lent bread)

- 500g strong white bread flour
- 7g sachet fast-action dried yeast
- 25g dark brown muscovado sugar
- 50g unsalted butter, melted
- plain flour, for dusting
- oil, for greasing
- 3 tbspcarbonate of soda, baked (see below)
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten, for glazing
- flaked sea salt, to serve
- **Method**
- **STEP 1-** Put the flour, yeast, sugar and 1 tsp salt in a large bowl and mix together. In a large jug, mix together 300ml lukewarm water and the butter. Make a well in the flour mixture and pour in the water, mixing together to form a rough dough.
- **STEP 2** -Tip out onto a floured work surface and knead for 10-15 mins or until smooth and elastic. Put the dough in a lightly oiled bowl, cover with oiled cling film and set aside until doubled in size, about 1hr.

- **STEP 3** -Once risen, knock out the air bubbles in the dough and divide into 8 equal pieces. Using your hands, roll each piece into a long rope about 60cm long.
- **STEP 4** -To form into pretzels, lay the rope in a U-shape with the curve pointing towards you. Take the two ends and cross them over.
- **STEP 5** -Take the ends, lift them backwards and press them into the curve of the U-shape. Repeat with the remaining dough. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6.
- **STEP 6**-Carefully place the pretzels on a baking tray lined with parchment and lightly greased with oil. Cover lightly with oiled cling film. Set aside for about 20 mins until puffy (not fully risen like bread dough).
- **STEP 7**-Fill a medium-sized saucepan with water, bring to the boil, add the baked bicarbonate of soda, then reduce the heat to a low simmer. One at a time, carefully lift the pretzels into the pan and cook for 20 secs per side. The pretzels will rise to the surface; flip with a slotted spoon.
- **STEP 8**- Use the spoon to gently lift the pretzels from the pan and return them to the baking tray. Once they have all been cooked in the water, lightly brush with the egg and sprinkle with flaked sea salt.
- **STEP 9**- Bake in the oven for 20-25 mins or until a rich, dark brown. Allow to cool on the baking tray for 10 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Best served on the day made but can be frozen for up to 1 month.

- *Lego Tower*

You will need

Lego Bricks

Or some other types of building bricks

A Lego man or play person

What to do

Build a tower as high as you want and put your person on the top then re-tell the part of the story when Jesus is taken to the top of the tower and told to jump.

- What will be the end of the story for you?

Have fun!

Make a medal

- **You will need**

White card, Colouring pencils

Scissors, Glue,
Something to make a hole, Ribbon

- **What to do**

First draw a circle out of the card. Then draw a bigger circle out of the card.

Then stick the smaller circle on top of the larger circle.

Then make a hole at the top of the circle.

Now thread your ribbon through the hole and join the ends

Now use your colouring pencils to write the words on the smaller circle



First your Name then "didn't get Tempted"

Then decorate the rest of the medal.

You can then wear this medal if you are tempted by something and don't give in.

Then you will be reminded of Jesus who didn't give in to being tempted.
