
Teachers, pupils and staff of Trinity St Peter's School and our uniformed organisations as they begin their summer break.

The Liturgy of the Word;

Epistle Reading; I Peter 2:1-10

Our reading today is read by;

Rid yourselves, therefore, of all malice, and all guile, insincerity, envy, and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

'See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.' To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner', and 'A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall.' They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, 'How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.' Jesus answered, 'I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand.'

St Peter's Church – Plan to Removing Restrictions

Everyone feels differently about the proposed plan to lift restrictions and many are feeling anxious about all precautions being removed. We want to have a plan that will make everyone still feel safe. We ask that if you feel we are not moving quickly enough that you have patience with us while we navigate through the next few months. These are the steps we will take for 25th July and August.

- 1) We ask that you continue to wear face masks and use the hand sanitiser while attending services.
- 2) We will not take temperatures at the door.
- 3) The choir will remain on the balcony so please use the seating in the choir stalls.
- 4) Congregational singing will be permitted but we do ask again that face masks must remain on and it would help if your volume isn't turned up too high!
- 5) We will keep the roped off pews in place but we will seat up to five people in each pew.
- 6) Communion will still be brought to the pews. Clergy or assistants will wear face masks, use the hand sanitizer and take all the precautions that have been in place.
- 7) The offertory plate will be brought to the altar during the service.

It is hoped that in September we will remove the ropes and the congregation will come to the front to receive communion. Any other decisions will be made at the end of August.

The Vicar and Churchwardens
