He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'

### St Peter's Church – Plan to Removing Restrictions

Everyone feels differently about the proposed plan to lift restrictions and many are feeling anxious about all precautions being removed. We want to have a plan that will make everyone still feel safe. We ask that if you feel we are not moving quickly enough that you have patience with us while we navigate through the next few months. These are the steps we will take for August.

- 1) We ask that you continue to wear face masks and use the hand sanitiser while attending services.
- 2) We will not take temperatures at the door.
- 3) The choir will remain on the balcony so please use the seating in the choir stalls.
- 4) Congregational singing will be permitted but we do ask again that face masks must remain on and it would help if your volume isn't turned up too high!
- 5) We will keep the roped off pews in place but we will seat up to five people in each pew.
- 6) Communion will still be brought to the pews. Clergy or assistants will wear face masks, use the hand sanitizer and take all the precautions that have been in place.
- 7) The offertory plate will be brought to the altar during the service.

It is hoped that in September we will remove the ropes and the congregation will come to the front to receive communion. Any other decisions will be made at the end of August.
