

Prayers of preparation

As we enter church we are reminded of God's presence with us. It is worth spending a few moments in quiet and prayer as we prepare for the worship that is about to take place.

We come together in the presence of God. We are called by Him to listen; to worship; to serve; and to witness.

Christ is with us. He nourishes our lives by this Eucharist that we may be made one in love with Him and with each other.

As we gather at the altar we must recall the promises and warnings to us in the Scriptures and so examine ourselves and repent of our sins. We should give thanks to God for His redemption of the world through His Son Jesus Christ and, as we remember Christ's death for us and receive the pledge of His love, resolve to serve Him in holiness and righteousness all the days of our life.

Please pray for your fellow worshippers and help each other to prepare for the Eucharist with such stillness and quietness as is possible.


**Gracious Father, listen to our prayers.

The Greeting


The president greets the people

through Jesus Christ our Lord.



Readings

Either one or two readings from Scripture precede the Gospel reading



At the end the reader says

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

We stand for the hymn

We remain standing and face the reader of the Gospel

Gospel Reading

An acclamation heralds the Gospel reading

All Alleluia, Alleluia.

The Choir will sing the Gospel verse

All Alleluia.

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end the reader says

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

We sit

We stand

The president says

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Creed

**All We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is,
seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.**

For us and for our salvation

**he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary
and was made man.**

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

who with the Father and the Son**


**is worshipped and glorified,

A minister says

All may exchange a sign of peace



Preparation of the Altar Taking of the Bread and Wine

We remain standing for the hymn

The gifts of the people are gathered and presented.

The altar is prepared and bread and wine are placed upon it.

The president takes the bread and wine and says

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this bread to set before you,
which earth has given and human hands have made.
It will become for us the bread of life.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:
through your goodness we have this wine to set before you,
fruit of the vine and work of human hands.
It will become for us the cup of salvation.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Eucharistic Prayer B

The president says

The Lord be with you

All and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

We kneel or sit for the prayer of thanksgiving

Father, we give you thanks and praise
through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word,
through whom you have created all things;
who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh;
as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin,
he lived on earth and went about among us;
he opened wide his arms for us on the cross;
he put an end to death by dying for us;
and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life;
so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now we give you thanks
because, in the incarnation of the Word,
a new light has dawned upon the world,
that all nations may be brought out of darkness
to see the radiance of your glory.

Therefore with angels and archangels,
and with all the company of heaven,
we proclaim your great and glorious name,
for ever praising you and *saying*:

All **Holy, holy, holy Lord,**
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,
and according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;

he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.



In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

Christ is the bread of life:

**All When we eat this bread and drink this cup,
we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus,
until you come in glory.**

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross,
his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world;
rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,
and looking for his coming in glory,
we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.
As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving,
we bring before you this bread and this cup
and we thank you for counting us worthy
to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people
and gather into one in your kingdom
all who share this one bread and one cup,
so that we, in the company of St Peter and all the saints,
may praise and glorify you for ever,
through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father,
for ever and ever.

Believing the promises of God, let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us.


All Our Father, who art in heaven,

Blessed are those who are called to his supper.


**All Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,

by keeping their hands at their side*

Authorized words of distribution are used

*Communicant **Amen.***

Silence is kept

The president says

Let us pray

to be a living sacrifice.
Send us out
in the power of your Spirit
to live and work
to your praise and glory.
Amen.**

The Dismissal

The president may make announcements before introducing the hymn

We stand for the hymn

Blessing

We remain standing

The president says

The Lord be with you

All and also with you.

Christ the Son of God perfect in you the image of his glory
and gladden your hearts with the good news of his kingdom;
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
be upon you and remain with you always.


All Amen.
