Our 275 committee beavered away on the practical arrangements, making sure everything was covered. A special thanks to Fiona Martin who spearheaded the event, to Mark Andrews who made sure stands were ready for the arrangers, to David Holroyd who looked after all the publicity, to the stewards and those who looked after the Coffee Shop and baked cakes and to the Revd Barry Dryden for preaching at the morning Eucharist. The wonderful spin-off of these events is the enjoyment of working together, getting to know new people and having a real buzz being part of St Peter's community. To be able to open our doors to so many people and have them all feel welcomed cannot be underestimated. Lieutenant of Merseyside and representatives from the groups within our parish including the Air Training Corp and local sports clubs.

Please put these dates in your diary and come along to St Peter's as we give thanks for our church and its ministry down through the centuries.

This month we welcome **Revd Gordon McLeod** who comes to St Peter's for his final year of curacy. Gordon has already completed his first two years in Maghull & Melling. But as his training incumbent retired it was felt that he should have supervision and support for his final year. Gordon did a placement with us prior to ordination and we are delighted to welcome him back as a priest and our curate.





We can all have a break for August before we start part two of our year of celebration! This starts early in September with a Community Fun **Day** in the school grounds on Saturday 3rd, a **Pet Service** on Sunday 11th after which there will be the **Harvest Festival Weekend** beginning on Saturday 24th with a Cabaret, a Scarecrow Shindig and the Harvest Thanksgiving Services on Sunday 25th. "Footsteps Through Formby"

The Need for a Name.

During the past 30 years or so there seems to be a deep need to look back in time as testified by the number of history books being sold and the many history TV programmes. Adverts for genealogies make available the history of whole families. To help organise times past we find names being given to periods of history eg The Bronze Age, the Dark Ages, and Regency. Many who lived during those periods would not recognise them as such. Not many iron age men and women would have seen much iron. Some of the names given were once proudly announced but no more, names such as the British Empire once seen as a stabilising influence on the world but now closely associated with slavery and land grabs. The term the 'Christian Era' is in fact meaningless. The Christian religion is still with us and the term is often used to try to relegate Christ's work to the past.

In the light of all this naming what would we call this period of the last thirty years or so? One of the titles given in several papers recently is a 'Time of Anxiety'. This implies that we are experiencing a greater level of stress than in other ages. This seems unlikely as previous periods of history are full of difficult times. A Tudor farmer watching his crop fail will be facing starvation that is as bad as it can get. The new deep concern about anxiety may be associated with individuals being exposed to new and threatening experiences such as artificial intelligence and social media.

What is interesting is the growing ability to talk about the stress we experience especially in dealing with personal relationships. A recent TV programme on 'Countryfile' looked at life on a small island in the Severn Estuary. Part of the work looked at restoration tasks undertaken by ex soldiers suffering from trauma while serving in the armed services. Their stories of re-establishing themselves was heart warming, especially in the way they opened up to people and their gratitude to the charity involved which had reached out to them.

The basis of a relationship is understanding compassion and reaching out among others. The word 'love' has for some reason become changed. Most Antique Roadshows have the experts say to the owner of the object under review, "Why do you love it?" The antique may be a bronze vase, toy or picture. The expert often says that he or she loves that style or period. Nothing really wrong with this save it degrades the word love.

To love refers to the relationship a person has for another and is hopefully reciprocated. To love an object for its own sake is part of the changes to the English language which takes place naturally but it destroys the real meaning of the word. Why can't those on Antiques Roadshow say they like something?


The reason to defend the old definition of love is to allow the meaning found in the bible to be fully understood. The relationship between God, Christ and us is reciprocal. That we can express the need for strength in prayer to the love we can experience through faith.

This has been true for centuries and has helped many through anxious times and still can. We may be going through a period of heightened anxiety but the faith and belief have helped so many. The charity which reaches out to help the ex-soldiers mentioned earlier is an example of the need for all to feel needed and linked to others. Anxious people often feel isolated and so the hand which is stretched towards you is important. Christ knew this so well.


FLAGS AT ST PETER'S - 100 YEARS ON!

After taking my seat at the Last Night of the Proms and seeing the wonderful display of Union Jacks, I was reminded of a photo I had come across whilst preparing the exhibition for Heritage Week. The image appeared in the flyer for a bazaar held by the folk of St Peter's in 1922 to raise funds for a new organ – precisely a century ago!

The old photo is rather more sombre than the exuberance of our 2022 "Last Night", and may have originally have been taken for a service of thanksgiving for peace after World War 1. In 1922 parishioners were exhorted to "Spend freely and be amply rewarded" -- nothing new in our 275th celebrations, then! The year 1922 was the 175th anniversary of our church at Green Lane, but there is no mention of that on the flyer.

Certainly our 2022 "Last Night of the Proms" was a great event of celebration of our 275th anniversary, and of Her Majesty's 70 years on the throne, being a joyous outpouring of patriotism and thanks.

Congratulations to David Holroyd and the St Peter's Singers for giving us such an enjoyable evening.



Our next meeting will be on 1st September, when we are hoping for a visit from Revd Nathan Thorpe although this has yet to be confirmed.


The toiletries previously collected for the refugees have been passed to Peter Paine, who sent a very big thank you for all your effort. We will start collecting toothbrushes in September.

Bible Study enables us to see how scripture can help us in our everyday lives. It is more fun to study and journey together and all that is needed is a willingness to read the passage.



FORMBY REFUGEE SUPPORT GROUP

Whatever your views about asylum seekers ours is not a campaigning group. What we do is a humanitarian response to a humanitarian need. From well before Covid we have been inviting asylum seekers from Asylum Link Merseyside to a lunch at St. Peter's Church Hall and a relaxing time

on the beach with optional visits to the church and games in the hall. We are an ecumenical group whose aim is to give a welcome to asylum seekers and demonstrate that not everyone in England is against them. They are, after all, strongly motivated, courageous and very often highly qualified. How else would they have got here?

They have come from Gaza, Yemen, and Cameroon, besides the more likely places such as, Sudan, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iraq, Iran, and Syria. This is not an exhaustive list but you will recognize that all these places are either currently experiencing armed conflict or have done in recent times or are places where members of minority religious groups are liable to suffer persecution. So the asylum seekers that we meet have genuine reasons to be here and carry with them harrowing stories from their past including seeing family members killed in front of them and crossing the channel in a small boat. Their response to our "Welcome" is always very positive, warm, heart-felt and sometimes emotional. For us it is very moving and gratifying.

Some of the original members of our group are not as young as they were when we first started and we would be delighted if there are others, especially men from other Christian groups, as most of our guests are men, who might like to join us. Through the Spring, Summer and Autumn we try to provide a "Welcome Day" once a month, excluding Ramadan and August, and meet about three times a year to plan them. 



As the devastating war in Ukraine draws on, with more atrocities every day, we want to say a heartfelt 'Thank You'.

On Friday 25th March, we had sorted, packed and dispatched, ten (yes ten!) 45ft articulated lorries of aid. More are planned as we receive more aid and funding.

Your support for our Ukraine Emergency Appeal has been overwhelming, and a tremendous encouragement to our teams, both in the UK and in Ukraine. In the past three weeks you have donated huge amounts of food, medical supplies, toiletries, clothing, and bedding. Our warehouse has welcomed over 100 volunteers, who have worked very hard sorting and packing this aid. You have also given generously of your finances and stood with us in prayer.

A special thanks to BGA Logistics for their huge help, and to all the Churches, Rotary Clubs and other groups who have hosted drop off points for aid.

Some of the lorries sent have gone to Poland, Romania, Moldova, and Hungary, where we have long established partnerships with churches and Christian organisations who are now caring for Ukrainian refugees.

St Peter's Church was originally "The Ancient Chapelry of Formby, St Peter Apostle and Martyr." It dates from the 12th century and was situated very close to the sea. St Peter's was part of the Parish of Walton, which is why the Rector of Walton is still our Patron. This chapel became "ruinous" and a new church, on the present site, was built in 1746 and consecrated on 19th July 1747.

CHURCH MEMBERS' ALPHABET

A Arches: to be seen in church buildings, usually in the nave. Also used in church hierarchies – like, archdeacon and archbishop, but never in a knave.

B Buttresses: outside supports to prevent the church from falling down. Also used to describe those who support the church from the outside rather than as pillars inside.

C Curates: assistants to the vicar, learning on the job, excused by all.

D Deacons: a kind of first year apprenticeship after ordination and before being made a priest. They wear their stoles crossways and are not authorised to celebrate the eucharist, absolve or bless. Comes from a word meaning service.

E Eagle: usually used for the lectern. An eagle is the symbol for St John, it soars the highest and is an emblem of spiritual insight. But practically, it has wide wings on which to rest a big Bible.

F Flowers: three cheers for all who organised a fantastic Flower Festival and Art Exhibition.

G Golf: What some clergy are playing when parishioners are told they are 'away on a course'.

H Homosexuality: the big issue dividing the Anglican Communion today. Jesus said nothing about it, so what's the problem?

I Ichtus: Greek for fish. An early symbol for Christianity, used as an anagram –Jesus Christ, God's Son our Saviour.

J Jumble sales: sometimes used as fund raisers for the church. But is God only worth what we don't want anymore?

K Killjoys: What outsiders think church members are. But not in St Peter's!

L Lettuce: the emblem of prayer and preaching where you most often hear, 'Let us...'

M Mitre: a conical (comical?) hat worn by bishops to denote authority.

N Nab: what the vicar does when she's short of volunteers.

O Organ: "a cross between a synthesiser and a symphony orchestra" (David Holroyd) St Peter's organ has 1312 pipes. For a demonstration see our website under Services.

P Pantologist: knows about everything. What a vicar has to be. There's more to vicaring then praying and preaching.

Q Quick and the dead: clergy trying to cover services in multi-church parishes.

R Rotas: like roundabouts with no exits. Impossible to get off.

S Six day week: what clergy are expected to work. Conditions haven't been updated since creation.

T Tea: the fuel of the church, along with coffee. Off-duty often prefixed with G &...

U: you matter! CH..CH is not CHURCH unless U R in it!

V Volunteer: the person every vicar loves to have. The more the better!

W Wardens: Representatives of the laity and officers of the bishop in a parish.

Authorised to "maintain order and decency in the church." Supplied with wands instead of batons.

X: Love you! When bishops sign their names they put an + before them. Better to put an x after them.

Y Ye, thou hath etc.: the language of the old prayer book. Still appreciated by many today.

Z Zzzz: If a sermon puts you asleep, then it has done some good.
