So he summoned him and said to him, “What is this that I hear about you? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes.

## St Peter's Church Christmas Tree Festival Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> to Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December

This year for the first time, as part of our 275<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, we are planning to hold a Christmas Tree Festival in church. Christmas trees will be decorated by charities and groups in their own particular style and displayed around the church. Each tree will have a collection box next to it so visitors can give donations to the charity/group who

have decorated the tree. Our aim is that there will be no cost to those taking part. 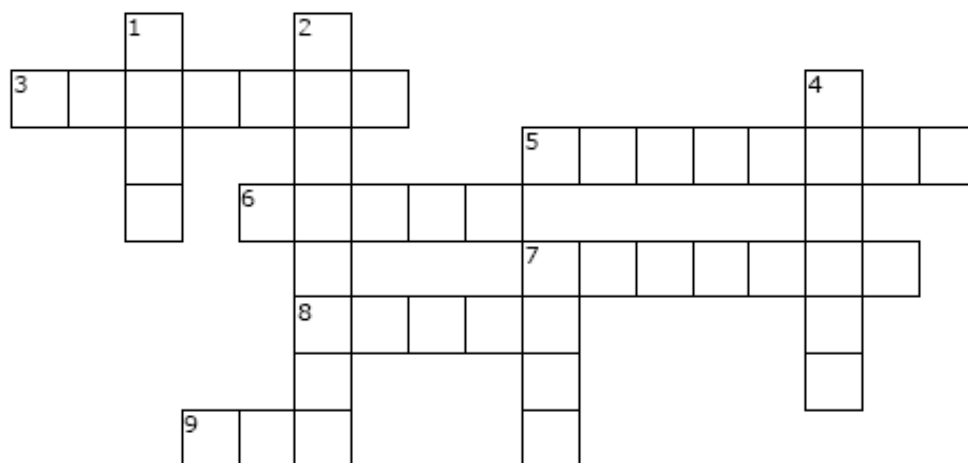
