Dear Friends,

It's Harvest time again! That time of the year which reminds us to be thankful for all we have and to remember those who live in need. It is also a time to be especially conscious of our responsibility to be careful stewards of our fragile and delicately balanced world which is



showing obvious signs of wear and tear as its health deteriorates through human neglect, abuse and greed.

Years ago, each coal mine had its own canary in a cage which went down the mines with the workers. Canaries are particularly sensitive to toxic gases which are colourless and tasteless. When the air was clean the canary sang, but when it ceased to sing it was a warning to get out as the air had become polluted.

Many scientists today are telling us that the global canary will soon cease to sing if we don't take urgent steps to cease the pollution of our planet.



Our Harvest Services are on Sunday 1st October and we are delighted to welcome back our former curate, Revd Nathan Thorpe, to preach at the All-Age Parade Service. Nathan is now Vicar of St Giles in Aintree. During the afternoon there will be the Relax Service for Older People. Then in the evening for our Community Harvest Celebration we will welcome Revd Poppy Thorpe. Poppy was the Curate of Holy Trinity and St Michael's, is now Vicar of All Saints with St Frideswyde in Thornton and is married to Nathan.

There will be refreshments after all three services.

Harvest is the time to gather in the good gifts we are given and this year we ask that you bring the **Time & Talents leaflet** that was included with last month's magazine inviting you to "**Get Involved**" in the life and ministry of St Peter's and offering different ways of doing so.

Some leaflets have already been returned. If you haven't got one, or need another, they are available in the church porch or in the Parish Office. On Harvest Sunday all the leaflets will be brought up at the offertory to be blessed and dedicated.

We will then go through the leaflets and note the offers and be in touch about how to help in the near future.

Remembering those in need, you are asked to bring an item for the foodbank when you come to church for the harvest. Our foodbank collection point in the church porch continues to be very well supported and we know what a big difference your donations make.

In conjunction with Harvest, we are again holding our **Scarecrow Shindig** in and around the church. Scarecrows can be erected and placed from Wednesday 27th September and they will remain in place for the Harvest Services. Do come along and have a look at the scarecrows and all the Harvest decorations and while you are there come into the **Bier House Coffee Shop** and enjoy coffee and cake!

Work continues on the church roof. It is slow and painstaking work, but we are confident that it will make our church waterproof and prevent any further leaks for a very long time. Steve Edwards and I had a guided tour of all the work and got a great view from the very top!

During October there is the **Annual Pet Service**. A service where we welcome in all our pets regardless of the number of feet! We will give thanks for the joy they bring and also for the animals that share our world.

Finally, we are planning to take a team to **Uganda** again in May 2024. The dates are now confirmed as **Monday 20th May until Friday 31st May.** We have obtained a very competitive quote for the airfare - £670 per person – in addition to which there will be the cost of accommodation – about £20 per person per night.



We do need to have expressions of interest as soon as possible – before 1st October. It is a great experience and anything we do makes a difference and is much appreciated by the people of Kalule. A reasonable level of fitness is required and the skills for working with children, the women's project or DIY. Please let me know if you have any questions.

God loves us and his desire is the very best for us.

What form that healing, wholeness and reconciliation will take, we cannot tell. It may be a growing awareness of inner peace and integration, help to carry us through a prolonged illness or disability, recovery more rapid than expected, or something we were not expecting.

Where can we find this?

"The ministry of healing is the ministry of prayer, word, sacrament, and pastoral care by which the Church acts as a channel of Christ's healing grace to give people that fullness of life that he intends for them."

Responding to Christ's commission to preach the Gospel and to heal the sick, the Church has been at the centre of care for the sick through the Christian foundation of hospitals, care homes, the NHS, the development of the medical, nursing, and other caring professions. The Church's role has changed. We pray for those within those professions as well as for those with needs.

The ministry of wholeness is often accompanied by the Sacramental means of healing and the laying on of hands, sometimes with anointing. We must not forget, however, that such things as friendship, forgiveness, listening, acceptance, and affirmation can also have a healing grace, as well as skilled counselling. So, in different ways we are all able to take part in the Church's healing ministry, looking forward in faith to the kind of healing He wills for those for whom we are praying.

St Peter's Church invites you the 'Service of Wholeness' where there is an opportunity for quiet reflection and prayer as well as the Sacramental anointing with oil.



'Did You Know'

MARRIAGE IN CHURCH (1)

In essence, marriage requires only the consent of the couple to each other and in the early days this could be sealed by the partners themselves without any supervision.

Also, it has to be said, marriage predates the Church. It is not specifically Christian and is found in all sorts of cultures.



In the early days of the church, couples were married in a civil ceremony and then, if they wished, they could have their marriages blessed by the Church in a religious service.

But because marriages could be contracted validly without any outside supervision, disputes arose. Was there a formal contract? Had there been a previous contract? It needed to be regulated. And so, in the Middle Ages, this is where the Church stepped in and came to have a more formal role in regulating marriage.

By the twelfth century, the Church was developing a legal system for adjudicating and solemnising marriages and discouraging informal contracts.

One of these regulations was to ensure that the parties were free to marry.

In 1200, the Council of Westminster laid down that no marriage might take place without three public announcements of the fact in church. This later became known as the calling of banns — which we still do today! At a time when services were in Latin, banns had to read in the vernacular.

Once the banns had been read, and no objections registered, the wedding could take place.



St Peter's Church was originally "The Ancient Chapelry of Formby, St Peter Apostle and Martyr." It dates from the 12th century and was situated very close to the sea. St Peter's was part of the Parish of Walton, which is why the Rector of Walton is still our Patron. This chapel became "ruinous" and a new church, on the present site, was built in 1746 and consecrated on 19th July 1747.

Harvest Festívals

The popular tradition of the Harvest Festival as we know it today is relatively recent and was the brainchild of a very eccentric clergyman, named Revd Robert Hawker, who was vicar of a remote parish in Cornwall called Morwenstow.

In 1843 he invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service for the harvest in Morwenstow Church. Everyone was invited to bring some of their produce as a way of saying thank you to God.



And so the idea caught on and hymns such as "We plough the fields and scatter", "Come ye thankful people, come," and "All things bright and beautiful" helped popularise his idea of Harvest Thanksgiving.

Along with the service Robert Hawker introduced a Harvest Supper with an abundant supply of cider and the Vicar singing silly songs to round off the proceedings!

But what made him really eccentric were things like excommunicating his cat for killing a mouse on a Sunday! He used to bring his nine cats to church with him. He kept a huge pig as a pet. (He should have started a Pet Service!!) He built a hut on the shore near his Rectory where he sat and wrote poetry and smoked opium!

His everyday dress was a claret coloured coat, a blue fisherman's jersey, long sea-boots, a pink hat and a yellow poncho! Once he dressed as a mermaid!

On the positive side he ensured that sailors who drowned in shipwrecks received a Christian burial in his Church.

At a memorial service 100 years after his death, the then Archbishop of Canterbury politely described the eccentric Robert Hawker as "a beyond man in a beyond place." His idea of celebrating of Harvest still survives today as one of the most popular services of the Church's year.

After our Summer break we were delighted to welcome Revd Jane Morgan to our September meeting. Jane had agreed to talk to us about prayer but initially gave us a brief summary of her working life and the call to ministry.



Before becoming an ordained minister Jane had worked for many years in midwifery, including as a teacher. A significant portion of this time was spent in Rwanda and Jane has agreed to return to us next year to talk about this period of her life.

Her talk on prayer was very inspiring and was concluded with a beautiful service based around a painting (called BE CALM) of Jesus and the disciples in a boat during a storm. We had readings from the Psalms and Mark dealing with calming the storm and referring to God as our refuge.

Our meeting in October is our Annual Service so hopefully as many members as possible will be there as we renew our vows.

We continue with our three charities and in October I hope we can all bring toothpaste for the refugees. Then shower gel in November when we welcome Revd Ted Woods as our guest speaker.


Haribo Service This is a relaxed service for children and young people at 12noon in church. The service is followed by drinks, toast, pancakes and Haribos in the Bier House.

Good news for all lovers of the Book of Common Prayer and others who are interested in our worship services.

My book *The Prayer Book Revealed: a Short Illustrated History* of the Book of Common Prayer is now published.



It includes one hundred and thirty eight illustrations of Prayer Books and their contents from the reign of Edward VI and before that of an illustrated manuscript (Book of Hours) used before the Reformation. These pictures originate from the collection of Prayer Books my father made while resident in the Norwich diocese over his lifetime and which some of you have seen when I presented a few of them on a Lent course some years ago.

The story plots the turbulent history of the Prayer Book from its conception in 1549 to the present day, its significance over that long period of time and the comparative worth of its replacements.

There is a short chapter (all the chapters are short!) on the spirituality of the Prayer Book and an enthusiastic Foreword by Bishop Humphrey Southern, Principal of Cuddesdon Theological College and previously bishop of Repton.

It is available on Amazon and other digital outlets but a cheaper copy may be bought from me (£15.00) on a Sunday morning.



THE TIMES' CLERGY SURVEY 2023

Of the conducting of surveys there is no end. From political opinions and voting intentions to dietary and drinking habits to the downright bizarre and obvious (remember Family Fortunes on tv!), hardly a day goes by without someone doing a poll somewhere.

So, there had to be a survey of clergy – and there was! The Times conducted a clergy survey in early August and published their findings at the end of that month. 5,000 clergy were randomly selected from Crockford's Clerical Directory to whom questionnaires were sent by email on topics such as doctrine, church attendance, sexuality, slavery and stress. 1,436 clergy responded.



This represents about 6% of clergy active in ministry.

Here are some of the findings:-

Almost two-thirds said that Britain could only be described as a Christian country "historically, but not culturally." The 2021 census showed that the proportion of people identifying as Christian fell to 46.2%, the first time below 50%. Although 56.6 % agreed that "even if decline continues, the Church of England will never go extinct." Well, thank goodness for that!!

A majority of those surveyed want the church to conduct same-sex weddings. At the moment, although the *Living in Love and Faith* process promises to permit and provide material for the blessing of same-sex couples, there is still some debate amongst the bishops about how that should be implemented and the content of the prayers.

Under church regulations, clergy are forbidden to enter a civil wedding with their partners. However, the survey found that nearly two-thirds of clergy wanted that ban to be lifted.

More than 80% of those surveyed backed the possibility of a woman becoming the next Archbishop of Canterbury. At the moment, about one-third of the clergy are women, the same proportion as women

bishops. However, it is still possible for a parish to declare that they will not have a female vicar, and there are 590 parishes which have done so. The Bishop of Dover, the Rt Revd Rose Hudson-Wilkin, responding to the survey, wants this to be reviewed.

Only 15% of priests backed the removal of slave trader monuments and memorials from churches, but two-thirds would like to see information added alongside them to highlight the links to slavery.

Two in five clergy felt they were over-worked or over-stretched. Two-thirds are trying to manage multi-church benefices, with 1 in 5 working across 5 churches or more and 1 in 20 across 8 churches or more. 32.7% said that their workload or other pressures in their ministry had led them to "seriously consider quitting the priesthood in the past five years", with one cleric citing "the sheer relentless nature of the job coupled with no help whatsoever from those in authority over us." That said, one half thought the bishops were doing a good job leading the church.

The radical cleric, the Revd Giles Fraser, commenting on the survey, said, "I'm not packing up my surplice. Tides ebb and flow. We are living through a period of unprecedented scepticism and indifference about the core message of the church: that God exists, that God is love, and that he came among us to save a broken humanity from its self-destructive sinfulness. The job of the clergy is to hold out in difficult times. To say their prayers, to celebrate the sacraments, to look after their parish. Faithfulness to this, rather than frenetic and nervous reinvention, is the order of the day."

And there speaks a prophetic and encouraging voice.
