The Eucharist

The word 'Maundy' comes from the Latin 'to command'.

On the evening of the Last Supper we recall Jesus' command, 'Do this in remembrance of me'.

After the Supper, St. John records that Jesus washed his disciples' feet and said, 'I have given you an example that you also should do as I have done to you'.

And later that evening, he told them, 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you'.

May this church be the Upper Room where we break bread with our Lord, feed on him in our hearts and souls, and seek his grace to keep his commands.

Lord Christ, we recall at this time how on that solemn Passover night you met with your disciples in the upper room and hallowed bread and wine as the memorials of your body and blood.

We thank you for this sacrament of our redemption and for all that it reveals to us of your love; and we pray that whenever we meet at your table to obey your command, "Do this in remembrance of me", we may know your risen presence in our midst, and feed on you, the true Bread from heaven, till we come to your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Jesus Lord and Master, who on the night before your passion took a towel and a basin of water and washed the feet of your disciples: give us understanding of what you have done, and teach us to follow the example of your humility, that by love we may serve one another for love of you, our Saviour and Lord. Amen.

All and fill us with your love.

On this night, he reminded his disciples that if the world hated them it hated him first.

We pray for those who are persecuted for their faith. Lord, hear us

All and give us your peace.

On this night, he accepted the cup of death and looked forward to the new wine of the kingdom.

We remember those who have died in the peace of Christ. Lord, hear us All and welcome all your children into paradise.

Taking of the Bread and Wine

At the Eucharist we are with our crucified and risen Lord. We know that it was not only our ancestors, but we who were redeemed and brought forth from bondage to freedom, from mourning to feasting. We know that as he was with them in the upper room so our Lord is here with us now.

All Until the kingdom of God comes let us celebrate this feast.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord is here.

All His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right to give you thanks, Father most holy, through Jesus Christ our Lord. For on this night he girded himself with a towel and, taking the form of a servant, washed the feet of his disciples. He gave us a new commandment that we should love one another as he has loved us. Knowing that his hour had come, in his great love he gave this supper to his disciples to be a memorial of his passion, that we might proclaim his death until he comes again, and feast with him in his kingdom. Therefore earth unites with heaven to sing a new song of praise; we too join with angels and archangels as they proclaim your glory without end:



All Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Christ is the bread of life:

All When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.

Lord of all life,

help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with St Peter and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

All communicant members of Christian Churches are welcome to receive communion. Those who do not wish to receive communion are invited to the altar rail for a blessing and are asked to keep their hands at their side.

Christ was obedient unto death. Go in his peace


The Watch
